- Was the service learning project for the World Conference
  - At the conference raised enough for 12 legs(4 was the goal)!
- Overview
  - Legs for Amputees-can be used for CAS project (done in 4 weeks)
  - Focus on fitting legs for children
  - 90% of children with disabilities do not go to school in developing countries
  - Mobility provides access
- Club Foot Repair for Babies
  - Every 3 minutes a child is born with clubfoot
  - Braces must be work for 4 years
  - Students would decorate the blank shoes
- Clean Water Access-WASH Project
  - Clean water access to developing schools
  - Developed program to build ownership in schools

- Program is on the revamp
- Where the IB is headed?
  - What does IB Leadership look like in action?
  - 1996 Mission Statement created
  - SNEAK PEEK of new IB rollout
    - 43 Standards and Practices
    - Triangle: Purpose (Top), Learning, Culture, Environment are all on the bottom
    - How is the school progressing within the Philosophy of IB?
    - Growth Mindset: how does the school know they are learning?
    - What does EXCELLENCE look like?-draft own goal of what your excellence looks like and how you will get there
  - New standards and practices-more holistic and aligned to the new IB Philosophy(see above)
  - Central Themes fit under specific or all sections
    - International Mindedness, ATL, Learner Profile, etc.
  - Leadership Intelligences-New Series-Handout\*
    - Insight
    - Strategy
    - Culture
    - Enterprise
    - Reflection
    - Learning
    - Relationship
  - Reflect on the intelligences and your own schools' mission statement and where your strengths and weaknesses fall.
